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A LETTER FROM OUR FOUNDERS



Dear Friend of GRASP,

We founded GRASP to break down the barriers between cancer researchers and patient advocates, believing that real progress happens when these groups collaborate. In 2023, we continued building on that vision, creating meaningful collaboration and learning opportunities.

This year, we returned to in-person Poster Meetups at smaller, more intimate conferences, including the Metastatic Breast Cancer Research Conference in Park City, Utah and the Advanced Breast Cancer 7th International Consensus Conference in Lisbon, Portugal. These in-person connections are incredibly valuable, allowing advocates and researchers to interact directly, share experiences, and foster deeper collaboration.

GRASP also expanded its impact internationally. At the ESMO Breast meeting in Berlin, Germany, we had the privilege of chairing a session on patient inclusion in research, featuring scientists and advocates worldwide. This session demonstrated how GRASP strives to break down silos and create bidirectional learning opportunities between advocates and researchers.

Our GRASP Reception at SABCS 2023, which has become a staple of the conference, was a highlight of the year! These face-to-face interactions offer a unique opportunity for scientists and clinicians to connect informally with the community impacted by their work.

We also hosted several virtual Huddles, which include small group discussions between advocates and researchers to discuss key cancer research topics. These conversations reinforce the importance of ensuring patient experiences remain central to the research process.

As we reflect on the progress made, we're grateful to everyone who has supported us—whether by attending our Poster Walkthroughs and Meetups, participating in Huddles, or helping us spread our message. Your involvement fuels our efforts to drive meaningful change in cancer research.







A SPECIAL AWARD AT THE GRASP SABCS 2023 RECEPTION

The GRASP Reception at the San Antonio Breast Cancer Symposium (SABCS) remains a highlight and a meaningful opportunity for advocates, scientists, and clinicians to connect in person. This reception celebrates the relationships and collaborations forged through GRASP's mission while reflecting on its remarkable impact over the years.



This year's reception featured a milestone moment: the presentation of the **GRASP Luminary of Change Award** to Abigail

Johnston. The GRASP team honored Abigail for her extraordinary advocacy, unwavering brilliance, and selfless contributions to the cancer community. Since GRASP's inception, Abigail has been a cornerstone of its success, serving as both a mentor and a member of the Board of Advisors.

Diagnosed with de novo stage IV metastatic breast cancer in 2017, Abigail has transformed her personal experience into a mission to amplify the patient voice in healthcare. Living in Florida with her family, she shares her insights and experiences through her blog, No Half Measures, while mentoring with GRASP and advocating for systemic change. Her journey began unexpectedly at 38 when she discovered a lump while nursing her young sons—a moment that launched her on a profound path through treatment and advocacy. Abigail's dedication to ensuring patient perspectives are represented at every level of healthcare embodies the very spirit of GRASP.



The 2023 reception welcomed over **200 attendees**, including breast cancer advocates, scientists, and clinicians. More than a social gathering, the event reflects GRASP's mission for fostering true partnerships and collaboration. In this unique setting, every attendee – scientist or advocate – stands as an equal, united in the shared goal of advancing cancer research and care.




HOW GRASP'S POSTER WALKTHROUGHS REKINDLED A SCIENTIST'S COMMITMENT TO CANCER RESEARCH

In a world where science often progresses in silos, GRASP brings together scientists and patient advocates for meaningful, bidirectional conversations. These are not just discussions about data—they're personal exchanges that bridge scientific discovery and the lived experience of cancer.

Dr. Eswar Shankar faced a profound loss with the passing of his wife to endometrial cancer. Her death deeply influenced his perspective and ignited a desire to honor her legacy through his work. Soon after her passing, GRASP selected his scientific poster for a discussion with patient advocates. He felt a deep appreciation for GRASP's emphasis on his work, which provided a significant motivational boost.

At the San Antonio Breast Cancer Symposium (SABCS) Poster Walkthroughs, patient advocates engaged with Dr. Shankar and offered feedback that highlighted the real-world impact of his research.



Dr. Shankar's story reflects GRASP's core values—equity, inclusivity, and the transformative power of science. By creating a space for shared insight and lived experience, GRASP helps transform personal loss into purpose-driven progress.

POSTER WALKTHROUGHS







GRASP Poster Walkthroughs facilitate dynamic, virtual discussions through Zoom, where patient advocates and scientists review scientific posters directly after major cancer research conferences, fostering a deeper understanding and collaborative dialogue on groundbreaking research.

Our Poster Walkthrough programs help advocates better understand the science behind the latest cancer research presented at scientific conferences, while also offering researchers the chance to hear from another group of experts—patients themselves. Each small group discussion matches a scientist with a mentor and five to six patient advocates to discuss and explore scientific posters being presented at cancer research conferences. In 2023, GRASP held Poster Walkthroughs virtually after three major cancer research conferences.

POSTER MEETUPS



After a long hiatus, GRASP resumed in-person poster discussions, rebranded as "Poster Meetups," at select conferences. These face-to-face walkthroughs are invaluable, providing direct interaction between advocates and researchers, enhancing personal connections, and promoting stronger collaboration.



Our Poster Meetups bring together small groups of advocates, researchers, and clinicians for a detailed in-person discussion of scientific posters at cancer research conferences, guided by an expert in the field. The interactive format fosters bidirectional learning, where researchers gain insights from the patient perspective, and advocates deepen their understanding of scientific concepts. These opportunities for engagement drive innovation in cancer research by keeping patient experiences at the forefront. In 2023, GRASP held in-person Poster Meetups at two cancer research conferences – the Metastasis Breast Cancer Research Conference (MBCRC) hosted by Theresa's Research Foundation in Park City, Utah, and the Advanced Breast Cancer 7th International Consensus Conference (ABC7) in Lisbon, Portugal.



HUDDLES



SHAPING CANCER RESEARCH THROUGH PATIENT VOICES

GRASP Huddles are in-depth discussions centered on cancer research and patient experiences. Each Huddle brings together a researcher, a mentor, and five to six patient advocates from various experience levels to explore a specific research topic. In 2023, GRASP coordinated several Huddles which provided researchers with the patient perspective that helped shape their projects while keeping advocates informed about the latest advancements in cancer research.

Yan Zhan met with patient advocates to get feedback on a survey to better understand how socioeconomic, clinical factors, and physical and psychological symptoms impact health-related quality of life for those diagnosed with metastatic breast cancer (MBC).



MAY 2023

Berlin, Germany European Society for Medical Oncology (ESMO) Breast Cancer Congress

GRASP co-founders Julia Maués and Christine Hodgdon participated in ESMO Breast, an international event designed for researchers and clinicians focused on the latest innovations in breast cancer diagnostics, treatments, and care. The 2023 conference brought together over 4,000 participants, 81 speakers, and presented 273 abstracts across 33 sessions.

Christine and Julia organized a session on Bringing the Patient Voice to Cancer Research, highlighting the transformative role of research advocacy in cancer care. Julia chaired the session and emphasized the mutual benefits for both researchers and patients when advocates are involved early in the research process. She conveyed how patient advocates not only help humanize the research but also inspire researchers, educate the patient community, and ultimately make research more impactful and fundable. She urged researchers to engage with a diverse range of advocates, stressing the importance of bidirectional, meaningful interactions.

Christine delivered a powerful talk for this session on **How GRASP Drives Bidirectional Learning Between Patients and Researchers**. She addressed the barriers that both patients and researchers face in connecting with each other and emphasized how GRASP's programs are designed to overcome these challenges. Christine detailed GRASP's philosophy of fostering collaboration between patient advocates and researchers and shared success stories of how these interactions are breaking silos and advancing cancer research.

Our very own Marlena Murphy, GRASP Program Manager, worked on the Patient Al Rights Initiative, a patient-led project to establish clear rules and standards for health Al, ensuring that patient rights, privacy, and well-being are central. It emphasizes governance by patients, transparency in Al usage, and securing the benefits of Al for those most vulnerable to its risks.
